


- **Building a safer community:** active shooter trainings, NRSA partnerships, street lighting improvements through the Police Explorers program
- **Intentional relationships with children:** BB card program, overtime beat grant, Cone with a Cop events
- **Community transparency:** social media used to engage with the public and solve crimes

Uniform Crime Report Highlights

- Sustaining decrease in part 1 crimes over time:
 - Crime down 9% from 2017 to 2018
 - Crime down 12% from 2016 to 2018
 - Violent crime down 5% from 2016 to 2018
 - 1 homicide: cleared by arrest
 - 3 shooting incidents: down by 57%
 - Shots fired down 61%: 24 incidents in 2018 with 7 (29%) cleared by arrest.
- Violent crime clearance rates at 66% - Midwest average for similarly sized communities is 41.4%
 - BPD cleared 25% more violent crimes and 15% more property crime than comparable cities



2019 Goals

- Attain full staff
- Complete analysis of cold-case homicides and begin investigation stage
- Expand focus on traffic-related issues
- Continue focus on overdose issues
- Continue NRSA & other neighborhood engagement
- Plan for a future law enforcement facility
